In case you haven't heard, we are open! Although the Library doesn't look quite the same as it did when we closed our doors on March 13, it's still wonderful to be open and to see so many of our patrons. We missed all of you! Staff have been diligently working on serving our community in innovative ways. We have created new types of programming including our first virtual Summer Reading Program, make-and-take craft kits, and other virtual programs. We have also introduced a new service called Doorside Delivery, bringing Library materials straight to your doorstep.

During these difficult times, circumstances are changing daily, and we are continually finding ways to improve our service to you. In addition to the newly available Doorside Delivery service, we have started accepting online Library card registration and eliminated expiration dates on Library cards. These are just a few things that we have done to make your Library experience more convenient.

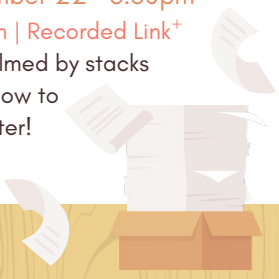

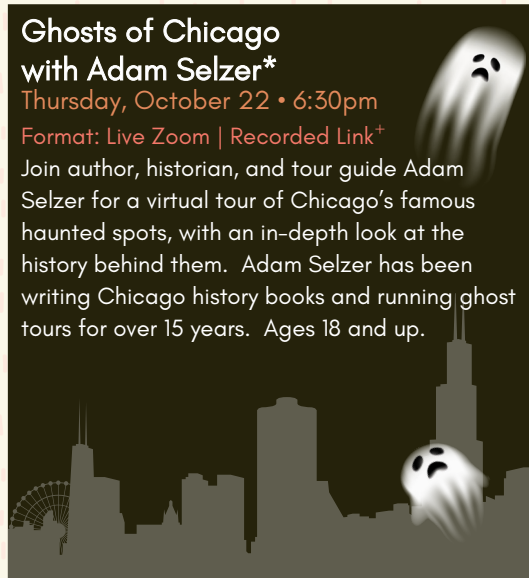


Ghosts of Chicago with Adam Selzer*

New Online Resources!

We are pleased to announce a suite of databases that are available free of charge to all GHPLD cardholders. These databases are great for everyone, from academic researchers to entrepreneurs and everyone in between looking to expand their knowledge.



Academic Search Premier

Full-text articles to support research in science, engineering, physics, technology, religion, and philosophy. Includes access to video from the Associated Press (AP).

Business Source Premier

Full-text articles to support research in accounting, finance, economics, marketing, management, and operations management. Includes access to video from the Associated Press (AP).

Consumer Health Complete

Full-text articles to support research in aging, cancer, diabetes, drugs and alcohol, fitness, and nutrition. Includes teen health topics for teens and parents.

Education Research Complete

Full-text education journals, covering all levels of education from early childhood to higher education, plus multilingual education, health education, and testing.

History Reference Center

Full-text articles to support research in history and genealogy and lesson plans to support student learning.

Legal Information Reference Center

This database is designed to assist the general public in legal matters of all kinds. Includes exclusive full-text for many top consumer legal reference books, as well as thousands of legal forms.

Literary Reference Center

Novels, short stories, poems, plot summaries and synopses, and literary criticism. Research guides, lesson plans, and citation tools support student learning.

MasterFILE Premier

A good place to start for research and homework. Includes full-text articles, reference books, primary source documents, photos, maps, and flags.

Middle Search Plus

Resources to support middle school students, including biographies, magazines, primary source documents, photos, maps, and flags. Includes Sports Illustrated Kids, Scholastic News, National Geographic, and dozens more. Articles include reading level indicators (Lexile).

Newspaper Source Plus

Full-text digital collection of the world's major news content. Includes millions of articles from newspapers, newswires, and news magazines. In addition, this database offers television and radio transcripts and ongoing daily updates from popular news sources.

Points of View Reference Center

Resources for students to understand issues, develop critical thinking skills, and develop persuasive arguments. Includes essays, overviews, articles, and transcripts on, citizens' rights, earth and environmental issues, global issues, health and medicine, and media and communications.

Primary Search

Resources to support elementary school students, including encyclopedias specifically for kids, articles from children's magazines including Highlights and Junior Scholastic, and a large image collection.

Science Reference Center

Full-text articles to support research in applied sciences, biology, chemistry, earth and space science, and energy. Includes the Science Image Collection, a database of high-quality science images from National Geographic, UPI, Getty, NASA, and Nature Picture Library.

Small Business Reference Center

Exclusive full-text for many top consumer small business reference books, as well as tools to address many business topics. Includes business videos, a help and advice section, and details on how to create business plans.
